Procedures and Requirements on Applying for Retention and

Reacquisition of Filipino Citizenship (or Dual Citizenship) under

Republic Act No. 9225

The Philippine Embassy in Nairobi wishes to inform the Filipinos under its jurisdiction of the following procedures and requirements in applying for the Retention and Reacquisition of Filipino Citizenship (or Dual Citizenship) under Republic Act 9225:

DUAL CITIZENSHIP

Republic Act 9225 otherwise known as the Citizenship Retention and Reacquisition Act of 2003 (more popularly known as the Dual Citizenship Law) enables former natural-born Filipinos who have become naturalized citizens of another country to reacquire/retain their Philippine citizenship by taking an oath of allegiance to the Republic of the Philippines before a Philippine Consular Officer. Upon reacquiring their Philippine citizenship, they shall enjoy full civil, economic and political rights as Filipinos.

Under the principle of derivative citizenship, unmarried children below eighteen (18) years of age, whether legitimate, illegitimate, or adopted, of former Filipino parents who reacquired their Philippine citizenship under this law, may also be deemed Filipino citizens, if they are included in the parent's application for reacquisition of Philippine citizenship.

However, there is another kind of dual citizenship, which is not covered by the law. This pertains to a dual citizen by birth: A child born in a foreign country (e.g. United States that adheres to jus soli principle, and Australia that adheres to jus sanguinis principle like the Philippines) when either parent was still a Filipino citizen is considered to be a dual citizen from birth (if born on or after January 17, 1973). The report of birth (ROB) of this child has to be filed separately with the Philippine Embassy/Consulate.

Dual citizens who wish to apply for a Philippine passport will need to make a separate application and submit the requirements as specified in "passport for dual or newly-registered PH citizens".

Application for reacquisition of Philippine citizenship

PROCEDURE AND REQUIREMENTS:

Submit the original and photocopies of the following required documents to apply for reacquisition of Philippine citizenship:

1. One (1) original and three (3) photocopies of the duly-accomplished **Application/Petition for Citizenship Retention and Reacquisition (Dual Citizenship)** form, typed or printed legibly in black or blue ink. (Application Form can be downloaded from the website of the Philippine Embassy in Nairobi, www.nairobipe.dfa.gov.ph)

- 2. Original and three (3) photocopies of **Philippine Birth Certificate** (for applicants born in the Philippines) or **Report of Birth** (for applicants born abroad) issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)
- 3. Four (4) photocopies of **old Philippine passport** (originals to be presented before the oath taking, when applying by mail)
- 4. Four (4) photocopies of **Certificate of Naturalization** (original to be presented before the oath taking, when applying by mail). In the absence of the same, the applicant may submit an affidavit explaining the circumstance by which the foreign citizenship was acquired
- 5. Four (4) photocopies of **Foreign Passport** (e.g. Kenyan/Seychellois passport, original to be presented before the oath taking, when applying by mail)
- 6. Four (4) photocopies of **Marriage Certificate/Contract** (for female applicants who wish to use their married names; original to be presented before the oath taking, when applying by mail)
- 7. Four (4) **colored photos, 2" x 2", taken within six months** before the date of application, showing a clear front view of applicant's face, with a **white** background. No sleeveless attire. Blurred or low-quality photos will not be accepted.
- 8 Payment of processing fee of US\$50.00

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS for Derivative Citizenship

- 1. Ensure that the appropriate portions on page 2 of the Dual Citizenship application form are filled up
- 2. Original and four (4) certified photocopies of the **birth certificate** of the children and their **foreign/non-Philippine passport**
- 3. Four (4) **identical colored photos, 2" x 2"**, taken **within six months** before the date of application, showing a clear front view of applicant's face, with a **white** background. No sleeveless attire. Blurred or low-quality photos are not accepted
- 4. Payment of Processing Fee of US\$25.00 per derivative child.

The applicant will be informed of the date for the oath taking before a Consular Officer at the Embassy/Consulate General. The applicant is required to take an oath and sign the Oath of Allegiance prepared by the Embassy/Consulate General. The applicant will receive his/her original copy of the notarized Oath of Allegiance, together with the Order of Approval, Petition for Reacquisition of Philippine Citizenship and Identification Certificate issued by the Embassy, after the oath has been administered.

If the applicant is a Bureau of Immigration registered alien, he shall surrender the original ACR and ICR/CRTV, or in its absence, an affidavit explaining the loss of said documents for transmittal to the BI.

Applicants scheduled for oath-taking are requested to come dressed in at least decent casual attire, which does not include sleeveless shirts (for men), tank top, spaghetti strapped or midriff blouses (for women), shorts of any kind, and slippers.

The copy of the Order of Approval of the Application/Petition for Reacquisition of Philippine Citizenship and Identification Certificate will be submitted as a supporting document when applying for a new Philippine passport.
