The outreach also included the display of posters and showing of gender and development-related infomercial videos from the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) to further promote and encourage a general understanding of gender-based issues and challenges among the Filipino community.





The Filipino community in Malawi appreciated the services rendered during the mission, especially because the current Covid-19 situation limited their ability to travel to the Philippine Embassy in Kenya to renew their passports and avail of other consular services.
