

PH EMBASSY IN NAIROBI CELEBRATES CHILDREN’S WEEK THROUGH PINOY STORYTELLING

NAIROBI – The Philippine Embassy in Nairobi, led by Chargé d'affaires, *ad interim*, Maria Rosanna Josue, conducted a storytelling activity at Pink Tower Children’s House, a kindergarten school in Nairobi, on 28 January 2022 in celebration of the Children’s Week.

CDA Josue gave life to Filipino children’s books titled, “*Ang Mabait na Kalabaw*” by Virgilio Almario and “*Bakit Matagal ang Sundo Ko?*” by Kristine Canon to around 45 Kenyan and other international students, aged five to seven years old.
