PH EMBASSY IN NAIROBI EXTENDS CONSULAR SERVICES IN TANZANIA

10 October 2021, Dar Es Salaam – As part of its efforts to continuously provide consular services to Filipinos under its jurisdictions amidst the pandemic, the Philippine Embassy in Nairobi conducted a consular outreach mission in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania on 09-10 October 2021.

With COVID-19 preventive measures in place, a total of 107 ePassport applications, five passport extensions, two visa applications, 11 civil registration applications, and 27 notarials/authentication applications were processed and received by the consular team composed by Ms. Joanne M. David, Mr. Leonilo V. Navales, and Ms. Sherlyn M. Roxas.







The two-day outreach also included the showing of GAD-related infomercial videos from the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) to further promote and encourage a general understanding of various gender-based issues and challenges among the Filipino Community.



The consular mission was successfully organized with the support and cooperation of the Filipino Community in Tanzania, led by Ms. Maria Agnes Aniana, and Kaibigan-Filipino Association in Tanzania, led by Mr. Wilmer Montemayor Uga.
